Report:

Narrative - Corporal Buonaiuto, along with RI Assistant Attorney General Patrick Youngs, interviewed John Ciacciarelli at the RI Attorney General's office in the presence of Ciacciarelli's Attorney Andrew J. Reich. Ciacciarelli provided the following information.

Ciacciarelli is the Vice President/Controller for Rossi Electric and has been employed by Rossi Electric since 2001.

Prior to working for Rossi Electric Ciacciarelli worked for investor Arnold (Buff) Chase.

Ciacciarelli characterized his position at Rossi Electric as a "step up" from John McDonough's Project Manager/Estimator position.

Ciacciarelli described the work that Rossi Electric's provides to their customers as High & Low voltage wiring , as well as traffic signal installation.

According to Ciacciarelli there are only two other electrical companies in the state that can provide the same level of electrical work; James J. O'Rourke, Inc., E W Audet & Sons.

Ciacciarelli stated that Rossi Electric employees about 25-30 employees. The laborers are members of the IBEW Union.

Rossi Electric was called by Steve Nappa and asked to place a bid for the electrical renovation of 38 Studios.

John McDonough put together the bid estimate for the 38 Studios job with the assistance of Rossi Electric President, Vinny Rossi.

Steve Nappa made the decision that Rossi Electric would get the electric portion of the 38 Studios renovation.

Rossi Electric was paid by Nappa Construction for the work they did at 38 Studios.

Ciacciarelli stated that he did not go to the 38 Studios' sight because there were not issues that needed his attention to rectify. Ciacciarelli met Michael Corso in downtown Providence shortly after graduating College when Corso worked for Cornish Associates and he was working for Arnold Buff Chase.

Ciacciarelli did not talk with Corso during the 38 Studios job.

Rossi Electric hired SYNETH as a subcontractor to install the low voltage electrical wires at 38 Studios.

Rossi Electric worked at 38 Studios for about eight months.

Nappa Construction still owes Rossi Electric \$138,000.00 for the 38 Studios job.

The total 38 Studios job was billed to Nappa Construction at about \$2.2 million.

Steve Nappa asked Rossi Electric to bid on the Tazza Restaurant renovation.

Ciacciarelli stated that he did not know Michael Corso was a part of 38 Studios or Tazza.

Ciacciarelli stated that he did recently call Steve Nappa and asked him about the State Police investigation. Steve Nappa told Ciacciarelli that the investigation is still ongoing.

Ciacciarelli does not attend political fund raises.

Ciacciarelli stated that Rossi Electric lost money on the Tazza job.

Ciacciarelli stated that no one suggested that Rossi Electric charge the work on Tazza to the 38 Studios job.

Ciacciarelli described the Rossi Electric Job Labor Journal as a report showing labor costs for a particular job.

Ciacciarelli explained the job #336 is the Tazza job, but is addressed One Empire Street (38 Studios address) because Nappa Construction was the general contractor for both.

Ciacciarelli stated that he and John McDonough both look for work for Rossi Electric.

Ciacciarelli stated that the 38 Studios job was the biggest job Rossi Electric has been involved in.
